# How can you support?

- Speak to your child on a regular basis about the work they have been set and encourage them to come and speak to their teacher if they are unsure of anything
- Check that they are using the guidance they have been provided with by their teachers including the task sheet and any notes in the lesson
- Read your child's work and help them expand their responses by asking 'why?' and 'so what?' This will enable them to gain higher grades in their work



# How can you support?

- Encourage them to build in time to allow you to **proof read** their work
- Encourage your son/daughter to create revision material from Day 1
- A lot of the content we teach in the coursework unit is also theory they will need to know for the public exam they will sit in Year 11 and overlaps with coursework topics.

- Talk to your child about your work so that they gain an understanding of different roles within Health and Social Care.
- If your child is absent, please ask them to see their teacher as soon as possible to find out what work they have missed
