

Sixth Form Working Together Agreement 2021-2023

THE MISBOURNE WAY

Our expectations are that we are all **Ready, Respectful** and **Responsible** so that all have an opportunity to flourish and succeed. The agreement below is a pre-condition to acceptance into the Sixth Form.

Students will be:

Ready to learn – Sixth Formers are whole school role models and we:

- Arrive at school on time and attend all registration periods, including all lessons, assemblies, enrichment and study periods, with the school notified of absences in advance by family contact. You understand that attendance of a minimum of 96%-100% is required throughout the academic year and that ongoing monitoring of attendance will lead to follow-up procedures for students who fall below the expected level of attendance.
- Stay on site at all times except break times unless we have a medical appointment or school permission to leave. We sign out of school if we are off site at any time. Leaving site at break times is a privilege that can be withdrawn by the school following a behaviour issue.
- Wear our Sixth Form dress code correctly when arriving at school, during the school day and leaving school. We wear an ID lanyard on site provided by the school.
- Keep mobile phones and headphones out of sight during the school day unless directed by a teacher as part of our learning, or in a permitted Sixth Form-only area.
- Focus on our learning, completing all work to the best of our ability meeting all deadlines set, moving on to independent work such as wider reading and 'non-required work' to meet the Sixth Form expectation of at least five hours of independent study per subject per week.
- Avoid plagiarism and ensure that our work is always our own and meets exam board rules.
- Understand that, having opted for a particular programme of study, we cannot alter our timetable without full agreement from the appropriate subject staff and the Head of Sixth Form, and no later than Friday 24 September 2021 at the end of 'Right Choices Week'.

Respectful of everyone – Sixth Formers are whole school role models and we:

- Show respect to staff and each other, using positive and courteous language and acting as a role model.
- Respect all school equipment and our school environment.

Responsible in your behaviour – Sixth Formers are whole school role models and we:

- Recognise our important role as role models to younger students, and we aspire to develop student leadership skills, working with and encouraging younger students in collaboration with staff, whether in the classroom or as part of extra-curricular activities or competitions linked to the smaller school structure.
- Only eat in the designated areas of the café or the Sixth Form study room and at designated break times.
- Care for each other and always raise our concerns to a member of staff.
- Behave in a manner that does not endanger the health, safety or wellbeing of ourselves or others.
- Participate proactively in the LEAP award programme to develop your skills and CV. This may include being asked to volunteer to support The Misbourne's Open Evening on Thursday 23 September and Sixth Form Open Evening on Thursday 25 November.
- Following the end of period 3, Sixth Form students are permitted to sign out of school to study at home if their last lesson of the day is completed, unless their family notifies us they wish for a student to remain in school to study.

Families will:

- Support the Behaviour for Learning policy including the school's reward and sanction system.

- Share concerns about their child's education, welfare and behaviour with the school.
- Take an interest in their child's work and achievements.
- Support their child as appropriate to complete their work, homework and independent study.
- Attend consultation evenings and support school functions.
- Support the school in achievement a maximum attendance rate for their child.
- Inform the school of any absence in accordance with the guidance.
- Ensure their child arrives at school on time.
- Ensure their child is in full Sixth Form dress code and wears that dress code correctly, including on the way to and from school.
- Inform the school if they do not wish their child to be able to leave early from the end of period 3 to study at home if their child's lessons have concluded for the day.

The School will:

All staff work as a team to consistently promote and uphold the expectations of ready, respectful and responsible so that all can flourish and succeed. Academic progress, attendance and behaviour will be regularly reviewed.
