I am writing to inform you of an exciting opportunity available to you this spring. The Misbourne will be presenting our musical production *Our House The Musical* written by Tim Firth, with music and lyrics by Madness. The performances will take place on Tuesday 11, Wednesday 12 and Thursday 13 February at 7.30pm in the main hall.


