Year 11 History Visit to the National Maritime Museum at Greenwich

The history team has organised an exciting history visit to the National Maritime Museum in London on Monday 24 February 2020, which is open to all Year 11 GCSE historians.

The National Maritime Museum has specially curated an exhibition to tie in directly with the AQA GCSE history curriculum and the 2020 site study of the Spanish Armada and the English Channel. In their GCSE exam, students will be asked a question directly linked to their knowledge of the Spanish Armada and Elizabeth I's rule over England. By visiting the museum students will have the opportunity to explore the museum and the dedicated AQA exhibition to allow them to develop a contextual understanding of the importance of naval warfare and conflict with Spain within Elizabethan England.

We will depart by coach from school at 8:40am and arrive back to school by 3.10pm in time for buses (dependent on traffic).

Students will need:

- A packed lunch
- A notepad
- A pen
- A waterproof coat, to walk to and from the venue
- Weather appropriate clothing – it may get quite chilly
- School uniform is expected to be worn, including correct school shoes

The cost of the visit is £18.80 per student. This is a voluntary contribution and no student will be excluded from attending the trip if you are unable to pay, however if insufficient contributions are received then the trip will not be able to go ahead. The trip is now live via Parentpay; the deadline for payment to secure your child a place on the trip is Monday 9 December.
